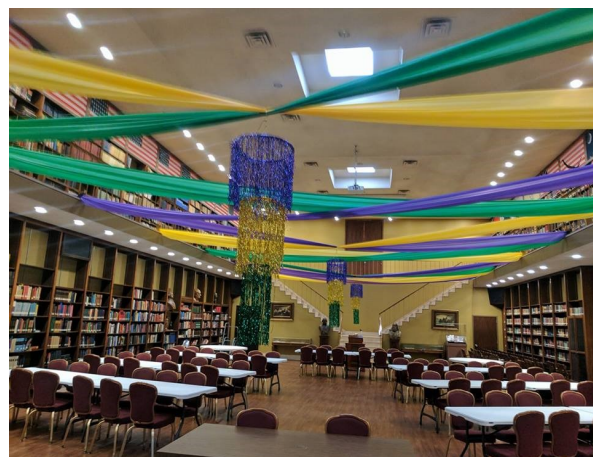

The Robert Burns Dinner is rapidly approaching and preparations for a first-class evening are underway. If you have never attended a Burns Night before you are in for a night of great food and entertainment, all in honor of Robert Burns. As most will know, Rabbie, as he was known as in Scotland, was called the National Bard of Scotland or the ploughman poet. He was also a Mason. One of the most gifted poets of his time, he could create poetry on a whim and it would become an overnight success.

Robert Burns Nights are held all over the world as close to his birthday as possible. His birthday is January 25th and had he been blessed with a long life he would be 259 years old in 2018.

The Burns Evening will consist of a mixer to help everyone get ready for a traditional Scottish dinner. The dinner will begin by bagpipers piping in the Haggis. This will be followed by kilted men performing with a special rendition of "Address to the Haggis" which really sets the stage for everything that follows. The meal will consist of a Highland Potato Soup, Gourmet Lowland Meatloaf, Chicken with Poblano Sauce, AuGratin Potatoes, Masonic Green Beans, a garden salad and for dessert, we will have Whiskey Bread Pudding. Who was Lee Lockwood?

Part 2: Lockwood's Masonic Timeline

Blue Lodge

- Raised in Fedelis Lodge #1127 in 1922 and became Worshipful Master in 1930
- Became District Deputy Grand Commander in 1933
- Elected Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Texas in 1938
- Charter member of James H. Lockwood and 1st Worshipful Master in 1954

Scottish Rite

- Received 32* in 1922
- 33* Inspector General Honorary in 1941
- Elected to Supreme Council in 1951 and held many positions until his passing

DeMolay

- Charter Master Councilor of Waco Chapter Order of DeMolay
- 1st Master Councilor of Waco Chapter
- Charter Member and Charter Sovereign of DeMolay Conclave
- Became Grand Master of the International Order of DeMolay in 1967

York Rite, Shrine, Red Cross of Constantine

- Chapter and Council degrees 1924
- 1945 became the Commander at Waco Commandery #10
- Potentate of Karem Shrine Waco in 1947
- Joined the Red Cross of Constantine in 1954
- Between 1972-1974 was granted the 50 year service award for not only Blue Lodge but the Scottish and York Rite as well as DeMolay and the Shrine.

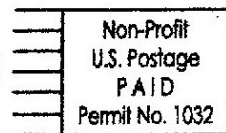
