Waco Scottish Rite Bodies Honors Organizations during their Night of Recognition Honors and Awards Banquet

The Stephen F. Austin Distinguished Service Award

Representing the Waco Scottish Rite in presenting four Waco area non-profit agencies with this year's service award are Mike Waldrop, General Secretary of the Waco Scottish Rite Bodies; and Claude Ervin, Chairman of the Waco Scottish Rite Charitable Foundation. Beginning in 1999, this award has been given by The Waco Scottish Rite to individuals and organizations in recognizing their humanitarian endeavors and outstanding community leadership. Along with a beautiful granite stone award with the face of Stephen F. Austin , each organization received \$10,000 from the Waco Scottish Rite Charitable Foundation in order to help them further the wonderful work and assistance they provide in the Waco area.

Accepting the award for MISSION WACO are John Calaway, associated executive director of development and volunteers, and Donnis Smith, board-member. Accepting on behalf of FRIENDS FOR LIFE is Inez Russell, executive director. Melody McDermitt, executive director, receives the award of Central Texas Senior Ministries/MEALS on WHEELS. Ann Owen, director of development, and Buddy Edwards, executive director, accept the award for Caritas.

Each of the charities is celebrating a milestone of service in 2017. Senior Ministries/Meals on Wheels and Caritas are marking 50 years of service to the community, while Friends for Life and Mission Waco started 25 years ago.

Caritas operates a food pantry and thrift stores to help families in poverty, but also began a case-management system in 2013 to help clients learn to become more self-sufficient.

Meals on Wheels delivers more then 200,000 lunches a year to older adults, and as part of Central Texas Senior Ministry operates senior centers and provides transportation to clients.

Friends for Life was founded by Inez Russell to help the elderly and people with disabilities live independently as long as possible and bring together generations. The organization offers a guardianship service in 81 Texas counties for those without a family member.

Mission Waco provides a variety of services and programs to assist the poor throughout the Waco community as well as globally. It was started by Jimmy and Janet Dorrell. Jimmy Dorrell continues as its executive director.

A Step in the Right Direction

Who was Lee Lockwood?

Part 1: Lockwood's Personal Timeline

1900-Born to James Harvey Lockwood and Gussie (Doss) Lockwood in Waco Texas.

Lockwood's family has roots in America dating back to 1630. Starting with Robert Lockwood who arrived from England and was a strong member of the expansion of Connecticut and later is family came to Texas in 1880.

1918- Graduated from Waco High and started at Baylor University and later transferred to the University of Texas.

Heavily involved in sports and was "touted" as an Outstanding Student by the superintendent. In 1919 he moved to UT to study banking (wasn't offered at Baylor). Member of Phi Gamma Delta... in 1960 received honorary PHD in Law from Baylor.

1922- Raised in Fedelis Lodge #1127

Become the Worshipful Master of Fedelis in 1930

1923- Married his childhood sweetheart Marie Coates married for 57 years. Had 2 daughters which over time have become almost 2 dozen grand, great grand and even great-great grandchildren.

1923-General Finance- a car loan and insurance company.

GF was the 1st car loan company in Waco (early 20's credit for cars was still a relatively new idea)

1938- Elected Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of TexasOne of the youngest masters in history of the GLoT

1952- Elected SGIG (Sovereign Grand Inspector General) of Scottish Rite

1980- Passed Away at Hillcrest Hospital on August 6th Buried at Oak Wood Cemetery Plot 19
